Laws against discrimination in employment must be enforced and that contractors who do not sign a guarantee of non-discriminations in employment should not be given contracts. The Federal bond requirement has been proved discriminatory because of most black contractors cannot get bonds because of lack of experience.

U.S. Department of Labor	4/13/71	Labor Department to investigate construction situation	Complaint filed by CCA complained of abuses by trade unions and contractors of Affirmative Action plan.
UCW (United Construction Workers)	11/16/71	Picket	Picketed Cordes Towing, 610-5th Avenue, charging firm with never having hired a Black employee.
NLRB (National Labor Relations Board)	2/27/72	Suit filed by NLRB	Filed suit against Local 2, Bricklayers and Masons, stemming from complaint filed in 1969 by CCA charging union with unfair firing of Sammy Lee Martin.
UCW	6/6/72	Violence at Seattle Community College	Flare-up between UCW and white construction workers at SCC when whites refused to walk off jobs. Three whites injured, and five Blacks arrested, including Tyree Scott.
UCWA	6/7/72	Vandalism	About 175 UCWA demonstrators along with some white supporters did heavy damage to SCC in protest for minority workers. 31 arrested.
UCWA	6/8/72	Shutdown	Tyree Scott asked supporters to call off shutdowns, and they voluntarily submitted to arrest along with three others.
UCWA	6/13/72	Advisory Committee vote	Voted 6-0 to give UCWA control of apprenticeship and dispatch of minorities to construction sites.
